Dear Colleagues...

It is our pleasure to invite you to join us for the Eighth Annual Meeting of the International Association of Medical Science Educators (IAMSE) to be held in New Orleans, Louisiana on July 10-13, 2004. This event, which is being hosted and joint-sponsored by Tulane University School of Medicine, will explore strategies for teaching and learning the fundamental sciences of medicine. It is directed toward course and clinical clerkship directors; basic scientists and academic physicians; rectors and deans; deans for medical education, academic affairs, faculty development, and CME; educational psychologists; and all those who have interest in more appropriately integrating science within the medical curriculum. As global interdisciplinary events, IAMSE annual association meetings attract participants on average from 30 countries representing all subject disciplines throughout human, veterinary, and dental medicine.

This year we have designed the program to address a number of issues reflective of our modern world that impact directly on science within the curriculum. Responding to bioterrorism and understanding the role of professionalism in medicine are but two examples. As in previous IAMSE annual association meetings, internationally recognized speakers will set the stage with topics for numerous interactive small group focus sessions and hands-on workshops. Poster sessions and oral presentations of original work have been expanded. By popular demand, Saturday day-long courses in faculty development have been increased to five concurrent offerings, and the registration limit raised to 30 individuals per course. A special Tuesday morning plenary session will address interdisciplinary issues, and the IAMSE Debate returns to consider both sides of another provocative topic.

Plans have been made for the majority of our meeting to be conducted in the Fairmont Hotel, a historic landmark of New Orleans. This will include the opening ceremony, plenary sessions, poster presentations, commercial exhibits, meals, receptions, registration, etc. Afternoon workshop and focus sessions will be conducted at the Tulane University School of Medicine, just a short walk from the hotel. This venue arrangement provides opportunity for all participants to experience the true flavor of New Orleans plus the traditional academic setting of the Tulane medical community.

Visitors will find that New Orleans as a city has many amenities to offer. Both the Fairmount Hotel and Tulane University School of Medicine are located in the heart of the city, only a short distance from the famous "French Quarter". Here one can find unlimited possibilities to enjoy Cajun cuisine and characteristic New Orleans jazz. In keeping with tradition, the IAMSE social event this year will provide registrants and their guests the unique opportunity to experience Mardi Gras – complete with floats, music, and traditional food.

We cordially invite you to join us this coming July for a professional development experience in the true style of the International Association of Medical Science Educators. This meeting will provide a forum for medical faculty to gain a better understanding of how the fundamental sciences may be more effectively presented so that they are relevant and appropriate to the needs of those in medical training.

INTENDED AUDIENCE

This meeting is designed for all those who have responsibility for teaching the fundamental sciences of medicine, which we define as the subjects arising from the traditional disciplines of Anatomy, Behavioral Science, Biochemistry, Microbiology and Immunology, Pathology, Pharmacology, and Physiology. We welcome IAMSE members and others representing allopathic, osteopathic, podiatric, and chiropractic medical schools, as well as those from dental and veterinary colleges, and especially our colleagues from the clinical disciplines of medicine.

MEETING HOST

Founded in 1834, Tulane University School of Medicine is the 15th oldest medical school in the United States. Today the medical school is but one part of the Tulane University Health Sciences Center, which includes the School of Medicine, the Tulane University Hospital and Clinic, the School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine, the University Health Service, the Tulane Regional Primate Research Center, the U.S.-Japan Biomedical Research Laboratories, and the Tulane/Xavier Center for Bioenvironmental Research. Most components of the Health Sciences Center are located in the heart of historic New Orleans, near the Vieux Carre (French Quarter).

FACULTY DEVELOPMENT COURSES

Five concurrent faculty development courses will be offered on Saturday July 10, 2004 from 8:30 am until 3:30 pm. C-1 BECOMING AN EFFECTIVE COURSE DIRECTOR

The purpose of this course is to examine the attributes that make an effective course director. In doing so, some common pitfalls may be avoided.

Participants will:

- discuss course director responsibilities regarding course content, examinations, policies, scheduling and faculty development
- identify effective use of course resources, e.g., faculty, texts, syllabi, lab support, student evaluations
- evaluate productive interactions between fellow course directors and deans of education
- analyze productive interactions between course directors and students

C-2 LEADERSHIP SKILLS FOR THE BASIC SCIENTIST

The purpose of this course is to provide basic science educators with fundamental skills for leadership roles within curriculum committees, research teams, and other coordinated groups within a medical center environment.

- describe the characteristics of effective work groups and teams
- define and design an environment for productivity
- describe the strategies and techniques of effective role models and mentors

- examine the role of learning theory in effective lecture-based and large group teaching
- analyze small group teaching and learning in terms of individual and group needs
- apply learning principles to enhance 1-1 teaching, coaching, and mentoring relationships

C-4 QUALITATIVE/QUANTITATIVE RESEARCH METHODS IN MEDICAL EDUCATION

The purpose of this course is to help medical science educators to use qualitative and quantitative methods appropriately and effectively in educational planning, evaluation, and research.

Participants will:

- describe the appropriate uses of common qualitative and quantitative methods in educational planning, evaluation, and research
- analyze qualitative data, such as the results of open-ended questions on surveys, interviews, focus groups, and observational field notes
- design effective structure survey questions
- identify resources for refining their skills in the use of qualitative and quantitative methods for educational planning, evaluation, and research

ABSTRACT FORM

Meeting registrants are invited to submit abstracts of their projects in medical science education, including innovative software applications. The deadline for abstract submission is **March 15, 2004**. Abstracts from individuals who complete registration by May 1, 2004 will undergo a peer-review selection for oral presentations and results announced by June 1, 2004. To be published, at least one Abstract Author must be registered no later than June 1, 2004. All accepted and qualifying abstracts will be published on the IAMSE website the beginning of June, 2004.

Guidelines for Submission:

- **Completed registration is required for publication of abstracts**
- A maximum of two abstracts will be accepted by any one Presenting Author
- All abstracts must be typed in English using 10-point Times New Roman font
- *Abstract, including title and author(s), must fit inside a box no larger than 17cm wide by 11.5cm tall. Use these borders as an example.*
- Type the title in bold, uppercase letters. Do not use abbreviations in the title.
- Using Italics, list the name(s) of the author (place an asterisk next to the presenting author) and the institution, city and state, and country where the work was done. See the example below.
- Electronic submission of abstracts is preferred. If sent by e-mail attachment, please use Microsoft Word
