





- Participates in NRMP to be ranked by one of our programs
- Started September 2013
 - 16 students 2013
 - 12 students 2014
 - Opt-in pathway to begin in August







Comparison of the three year pathway with the four year pathway

NYU School of Medicine Three Year MD Pathway

- Continuum of training from undergraduate medical school through graduate residency training
- Creation of the UME-GME continuum
 - Tracking of students performance and development
 - Aligns with ACGME's Next Accreditation System
- Intensive mentorship begins in first year
- Integration into departments through education (shadowing, grands rounds)
- Research opportunities


Benefits of the 3 year pathway programs

- Accelerated entry to desired field
- Particular value to those with advanced degrees and career interests
- For those in competitive fields, reduces need for extensive interviewing
- Reduced debt, earlier earnings
- Enhanced and earlier mentoring by departments
- Focus on education across the UME-GME

Concerns about 3-Year Graduates Entering Residency (Program Directors)


Degree of Concern About 3-Year Pathway Graduates Compared to 4-Year Graduates: Program Directors (n=880)


