## **BOUNCING FORWARD:** MENTAL WEALTH FOR ALL

Sunday, June 5, 2022, 8:45 AM - 9:45 AM

This session will explore the role of the community in ensuring the wellbeing of all within it. The community within any educational setting includes the learner, the educator, the (intended) outcomes and importantly the environment. Jo will explore aspects of each in her role as Dean of students that allows the community to flourish.

Our philosophy at Bond University and within faculty is to ensure each student has a personalised experience and thrive. Jo's research focus is specifically in the area of student (and staff) well-being and its alignment within curricula

using empirical evidence. Jo has coordinated the recent review of mental health and well-being within the University as the chair of the promoting well-being working group. The group contributes to the work of the Student Wellbeing and Safety Advisory Committee that reports directly to the VC. Jo contributed to the publication of the Medical student wellbeing – a consensus statement from Australia and New Zealand in 2019 and led the writing of the Learner Wellbeing chapter in the Understanding Medical Education; Evidence, Theory and Practice textbook.

#### THE INTERPROFESSIONAL Dance: Education Now Ane At a distance

#### Sunday, June 5, 2022, 12:45 PM - 2:00 PM

Meeting the complex needs of our patients goes beyond the boundary of one profession. It requires teamwork and collaboration with other professions and, as a precursor, requires interprofessional education (IPE). IPE requires additional considerations in curriculum design with healthcare simulation a preferred medium for IPE. Interprofessional education requires brave examination of professional boundaries and in the process, skillfully blurring boundaries and creating new boundaries. The pandemic has provided glimpses in how IPE and healthcare simulation will be provided at a

distance. Clinicians and Educators are often the designee of such IPE activities, challenged to facilitate the learning of a myriad of professions simultaneously with new technologies. Such boundary-spanning responsibilities seem daunting.

This talk aims to 1) discuss the importance of IPE and how simulation is a vehicle for achieving quality IPE, 2) highlight the role of clinicians as educators as IPE leaders contributing to a new field, and 3) provide tools to assist educators in creating learning beyond boundaries.

Dr. Janice Palaganas is a Simulationist, Behavioral Scientist, Humanitarian, Patient Safety Advocate, Academician, and Nurse Practitioner. Dr. Palaganas earned both her Bachelors and Masters degrees from the University of Pennsylvania and her doctoral research degree from Loma Linda University, California. She is a Professor of Interprofessional Studies at Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH) Institute of Health Professions and faculty for Harvard Medical School, Department of Anesthesia, Critical Care, and Pain Medicine and the Center for Medical Simulation (CMS). Dr. Palaganas has developed a passion in teamwork from her background as an emergency nurse, trauma nurse practitioner, director of emergency and critical care services, and faculty for schools of medicine, nursing, allied health, management, and emergency medicine. She has led a number of prominent instructor courses, educating educators in simulation and IPE globally and has developed many online environments including CMS's interprofessional virtual campus as the principal investigator of a board grant awarded by the Josiah Macy Jr. Foundation.

## **PLENARY ADDRESS** Planning medical education for 2042 — Science, systems and sociology

#### Monday, June 6, 2022, 8:45 AM - 9:45 AM

Is medical education stuck in 20th-century models? What do students, the profession and society need for the future? What do we keep, what do we jettison and what do we create anew? What should be our immediate and long-term goals, and how will we assess individuals and programs?

Louis N. Pangaro, M.D., MACP is Professor of Medicine at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences, Bethesda Maryland where he has served as Chair of Medicine and as Interim Dean. He has focused on improving the fairness and validity of evaluations in the clinical setting, introducing the

concept of "synthetic", developmental frameworks - such as the Reporter-Interpreter-Manager-Educator framework - for defining expectations of students and residents. He created "standardized examinees" to calibrate the validity of the prototype clinical skills examination of USMLE. He has served on the editorial boards of Academic Medicine and Teaching and Learning in Medicine. In 2018 he received the John P. Hubbard Award from the NBME for excellence in the field of evaluation in medicine.

## **PLENARY ADDRESS**

#### HEALTH SCIENCE EDUCATION GETS Culturally humble

#### Tuesday, June 7, 2022, 11:30 AM - 12:30 PM

The current state of affairs with respect to the COVID-19 pandemic and increased racial unrest shows the need for diversity, equity and inclusion in society is greater than ever. Health care, specifically, has a long and storied history of inequities caused by racism and discrimination and have intensified during the pandemic. Public health has long known that a person's social, economic, and physical environment shape their health significantly, and these factors are directly tied to racism. However, we can be proactive in better preparing health care providers and clinicians to dismantle these inequities through conscious consideration, intentional education and engagement of cultural humility.



Juliana Mosley-Williams, PhD Special Assistant to the President for DEI Salus University (USA)

The diversity and inclusion concept of cultural humility, developed by Drs. Melanie Tervalon and Jann Murray-Garcia in 1998, was an attempt to address the challenge of implementing multicultural education to medical students and staff that aids them in providing health care to an increasingly diverse population. Cultural humility is a process-oriented approach that extends the limitations of cultural competency by incorporating a lifelong commitment to self-evaluation and self-critique, fixing power imbalances and establishing mutually beneficial partnerships and institutional accountability. The concept shifts the focus from learning "other" and encourages one to examine and perform the necessary work on self, in a way that fosters humble engagement.

This session will challenge participants to consider and further explore the use of cultural humility as a foundational framework for training and education on their campuses and clinics. Further, it will encourage them think about their own personal biases and collectively learn to truly embrace, appreciate, and live communally with those with different experiences and values than theirs.

Juliana M. Mosley-Williams has 20+ years of experience in education. Dr. J, as she is called by her students, currently serves as the Special Assistant to the President for Diversity, Equity & Inclusion at Salus University in Elkins Park, PA and previously held several positions in higher education as the Chief Diversity, Inclusion & Community Relations Officer at Chestnut Hill College, a Vice President for Student Affairs & Enrollment Management at Lincoln University, Edward Waters College, Marygrove College, and Philander Smith College; the Director of Multicultural Affairs at John Carroll University; the Executive Assistant to the President at Kentucky State University; and High School Business Teacher in Houston Independent School District. Juliana also serves as a consultant, having presented more than 80 times, to include a TEDx Talk, regional and national conferences, universities, non-profit organizations, government agencies, and corporations. In these instances, she provided training and development workshops in diversity and inclusion, leadership transition, strategic planning, and student development. Juliana earned a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership and M.A. in Curriculum and Teacher Leadership from Miami University of Ohio, B.S. in Business Education from Ball State University, and CDP from the National Diversity Council.

Throughout his nearly 35 years in medical education, Dr. Vari has won numerous awards and honors; contributed in abundance to research, scholarship and educational activities; been an instrumental leader in the formation and adaptation of medical schools across the United States and has mentored, formally and informally, thousands of students, colleagues and peers. He has been a member of IAMSE since 2001, recently receiving his 20-year membership certificate. He served on the IAMSE Annual Program Committee for seven years, most recently chairing the 2019 program in Roanoke, VA, USA. He was a member of the Membership Committee for ten years, the Professional Development Committee for five years, and the Chairs Committee for ten years. He was also a member of the Webcast Audio Seminar Committee, of which he was chair for five years.

Dr. Vari served four terms on the Board of Directors, two as a Board member and two as a member of the Executive team. He served as President of the Association from 2018-2020. Over the years he delivered two plenary addresses at IAMSE annual meetings, several workshops and focus sessions, and was awarded the Outstanding Reviewer Award for his contributions to Medical Science Educator, the Journal of the Association.



## AWARDS

#### DISTINGUISHED CAREER AWARD For excellence in teaching and Educational Scholarship

This award recognizes an IAMSE member who has a distinguished record of educational scholarship, including educational research and dissemination of scholarly approaches to teaching and education. Candidates should be Professor, Associate Professor, or equivalent rank, or have demonstrated greater than 10 years of educational scholarship. Additionally, candidates must have a significant record of engagement within IAMSE.

Award recipients are selected based on the impact, ingenuity, and longevity of educational scholarship and their records of publications, presentations, and other forms of dissemination of educational scholarship. IAMSE members may self-nominate or be nominated by another IAMSE member. The Educational Scholarship Committee reviews all nominations and supporting documentation based on established criteria and selects finalists. Final selection of each award recipient rests with the Awards Committee. A finalist who does not win the award will be automatically reconsidered the next year, if they agree and update their nomination file.



#### Kathryn Huggett, PhD

Professor of Medicine Director, Teaching Academy; Assistant Dean; Larner College of Medicine at the University of Vermont (USA)

Dr. Kathryn N. Huggett is Director of The Teaching Academy, Robert Larner, MD '42 Professor in Medical Education, and Assistant Dean for Medical Education at the University of Vermont Larner College of Medicine. Dr. Huggett is currently a Member-at-Large for the AAMC Northeast Group on Educational Affairs (NEGEA) and Conference Chair for the 2020 NEGEA Annual Conference. She is a past President of the Society of Directors of Research in Medical Education (SDRME) and the society's current senior representative to the AAMC Council of Faculty and Academic Societies (CFAS). Dr. Huggett also serves as Past Chair of the national Academies Collaborative and is a past member of the IAMSE Board of Directors. Her recent publications address academic program quality, faculty recognition, curricular innovation, and interprofessional education. She is co-editor of the book, An Introduction to Medical Teaching, now in its second edition. In addition, she has conducted research and published in the areas of medical school admissions, preparation for Graduate Medical Education, undergraduate honors education, and professional development.



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### EARLY CAREER AWARD FOR Excellence in teaching and Innovation

This annual award honors an IAMSE member who has made significant innovations to the field in the short time they have focused their careers toward enhancing teaching, learning and assessment. Candidates for this award will be Assistant Professor or equivalent rank, or have demonstrated less than 10 years of educational scholarship. An award recipient will have a record of excellence in teaching at his/her institution and possess a record of engagement within IAMSE. It is recognized that, while the successful nominee will have a proven track record of innovating and helping advance the art of teaching, s/he may not yet have achieved significant accomplishments in scholarship. Nominations of members who have been active teachers (e.g., presenters and facilitators) at the annual IAMSE meetings are particularly encouraged. IAMSE members may self-

nominate or be nominated by another IAMSE member. The Educational Scholarship Committee reviews all nominations and supporting documentation based on established criteria and selects finalists. Final selection of each award recipient rests with the Awards Committee.

Jaya Yodh, PhD is a Teaching Associate Professor in the Department of Biomedical and Translational Sciences at Carle Illinois College of Medicine (Carle Illinois), an engineering-integrated medical school at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (UIUC). She has 23 years of professional expertise encompassing medical education in settings of both traditional and integrated curricula along with interdisciplinary teaching and research bridging biomedical and quantitative sciences. At Carle Illinois, Dr. Yodh holds multiple educational roles as a Medical Education Problem-Based Learning (PBL) Facilitator, Biochemistry Thread Director, and Director of the USMLE Step 1 Review course. Her current medical educational and research interests focus on integration of the basic sciences within systems-based curricula, innovations in PBL, and USMLE Step 1 preparation. Prior to joining Carle Illinois, Dr. Yodh held positions on the Biochemistry Faculty at Midwestern University, AZCOM in Glendale, Arizona from 1997-2006 where she taught students in the Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine, Physician Assistant, and Biomedical Sciences programs, and then at the UIUC Department of Physics until 2017 serving in dual roles as Research Faculty and Director of Education and Outreach for an NSF Physics Frontiers Center where she directed research-based courses in biological physics. Her research has led to publications on Med-Ed innovations and genome maintenance and chromatin dynamics using single-molecule biophysics tools.




